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Morningstar ratings are specific metrics of performance and do not represent absolute performance of any fund. Morningstar ratings for the funds shown reflect performance as of June 30, 2023. The value of the Portfolio will fluctuate as the market fluctuates. The market values of the Portfolio's holdings rise and fall from day to day, so investments may lose value. For each fund with at least a three-year history, Morningstar calculates a Morningstar RatingTM based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a fund is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Morningstar Rating is for the share class noted only; other classes may have different performance characteristics.

Large Cap Growth was rated 3, 4 and 5 stars against 1117, 1032 and 791 funds in the category, for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods, respectively. Discovery Value was rated 3, 3 and 4 stars against 444, 420 and 324 funds in the category, for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods, respectively. Sustainable Global Thematic was rated 3, 4 and 5 stars against 317, 276 and 183 funds in the category, for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods, respectively. Small Cap Growth was rated 2, 3 and 4 stars against 560, 525 and 390 funds in the category for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods, respectively. Discovery Growth was rated 2, 2 and 2 stars against 519, 486 and 379 funds in the category, for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods, respectively. Bond Inflation Strategy was rated 4, 5 and 5 stars against 199, 195 and 135 funds in the category, for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods, respectively. Global Bond was rated 3, 3 and 3 stars against 123, 102 and 63 funds in the category for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods, respectively.

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The Retirement Plan Advisory Group™ (RPAG™) Scorecard System™ is a proprietary institutionally based investment scoring system that incorporates both quantitative and qualitative factors. The Scorecard System™ is a proprietary institutionally based investment scoring system that incorporates both quantitative factors. The Scorecard System is built around pass/fail criteria, on a scale of 0 to 10 (with 10 being the best). RPAG uses separate methodologies to assess active, passive, and asset allocation strategies. Active and asset allocation strategies are evaluated over a five-year time period, and passive strategies are evaluated over a three-year time period. The RPAG Score is calculated on a quarterly basis. The Score is 80% quantitative and 20% qualitative. Combined, these factors are one way of measuring the relative performance, characteristics, behavior, and overall appropriateness of a fund for inclusion into a plan as an investment option.



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
